MHS Archive Acquisition

Several months ago, research for an inquiry from Northern York County Historical Society led us to find that Maytown had a well-known needlework teacher from the early 1800's. Several samplers by the students of Catharine Welshans Buchanan now hang in some very prestigious galleries and museums and have sold at auction for tens of thousands of dollars.

Many of you know that one member of our archive team, Deb Gepfer, enjoys needlework and quilting and is a member of the Delaware Valley Historic Sampler Guild. Doing the research for NYCHS, sent Deb down a rabbit hole hoping to acquire a sampler for our museum with a Mavtown connection that was affordable. With the help of her friend and fellow stitcher, Susan Heydt, a Lancaster County sampler was found at auction with an auction estimate of \$80-\$120 and amazingly, the sampler was attributed to a young lady who was probably born in Maytown! Since Susan and her husband, Bruce reproduce antique samplers for cross stitchers and sell the charts through their business, "The Old Man and the Bea", the ladies hoped to buy the sampler, reproduce it and sell the charts to raise money for the MHS archive project.

Deb bid on the sampler and began to research the child who stitched it. The

sampler gave her several clues to get her started. The sampler tells us that the stitcher, Ann Francis Breneman, made the sampler in 1855 in the 12th year of her age. The auction catalog provided the following information: "Identified as Ann Frances (Francis) Breneman (Brennaman), who was born on January 16, 1844, in likely Maytown, Lancaster Co., PA to parents, Jacob Breneman (1818-1848) and Barbara Breneman (1820-1909). Ann, who went by Frances, married John E. Hunter around 1865, and the couple moved to Shiloh, Richland Co., OH by 1870 and had at least three daughters. Frances died on January 26, 1926, and is buried along with her husband at Maytown Union Cemetery in Maytown, PA." With this information, Deb went to Ancestry.com, Newspapers.com and several other genealogy sites to try to find additional family members of Frances. The search was successful! Deb was able to find the names of the daughters of John and Frances Hunter and their children and grandchildren. The research led her to find a descendant of Frances who held an important position here in town and whose nephew is still a resident.

Even though we were unable to find a connection with Catharine Buchanan's needlework school, the sampler has been

purchased and reproduced as a cross stitch chart. Deb is currently stitching the model and is hoping to unveil both the antique sampler and model at Mayfest 2025. It is also hoped that the charts will be ready for sale at that time. Who is the descendent of Frances? Come out to Mayfest to find the answer and more information about the Breneman/Hunter family!
